# South Molton Museum opened in 1952, the same year as Queen Elizabeth II ascended the throne!

#### A Very Brief History of South Molton Museum

The museum was originally housed on the first floor in the Council offices in number 1 East Street. Alderman Loosemore was Mayor of south Molton when the museum was still new. He received a medal from Queen Elizabeth II for the coronation which is on display in the museum at the moment. The first curator was Mr. L. Gingell, who also had his own private museum and collection of artifacts.

By December 1952, the museum was extremely popular receiving over 1000 visitors in just a few months. However, by 1959 complaints began to be made about the steep steps which people had to climb to get the museum. There were also criticisms over the neglect of the museum with many people calling for it to be moved somewhere else.

It wasn't until 1966 that the museum was moved to its current location in the Town Hall. At this time, it boasted over 600 exhibits. Interestingly, the curator at the time, Mr. Webber who was formerly a bailiff, lived in the property for 30 years previously.

Today, the museum is much loved in the community and the dedicated volunteers continue to make it a place which both celebrates the town's heritage and provides interesting information ann activities for its visitors.
